



Nemours PNP Fellowship Frequently Asked Questions:

What is the goal of the fellowship?

Post-graduate training programs for Advanced Practice Nurses are growing. The intent of the fellowship is to provide a year-long, post-graduate training experience that allows for protected learning time, exposure to pediatric subspecialties, and a primary care continuity clinic. The successful fellow will gradually increase their clinic template (number of patients seen per day) each quarter, for a gradual progression over the year to a standard pediatric primary care patient schedule.

Do I need to graduate from my program before I apply for the fellowship?

No, you do not. You will need to complete board examination and licensure prior to the start date of the Fellowship, but you may apply before you complete the program.

What is the start date of the fellowship?

The start date is either October 1st, or November 1st. The start date is selected based on accepted candidates program completion and ability to obtain licensure. However, the start date will not be later than November 1st, so all requirements must be completed by that date.

How many fellows are in each cohort?

We place two fellows each year.

Is this a paid fellowship?

Yes, as an APRN fellow at Nemours/A. I. du Pont Hospital for Children, you will be paid an entry level APRN salary with full benefits.

Do you interview candidates for the fellowship?

Candidates for interviews will be selected following review of application materials. Interviews occur in July and early August.

Am I required to sign an employment contract if I am accepted into the fellowship?

No, we do not require fellows to sign a commitment to work for Nemours following the fellowship. It is our hope, however, that our fellows will remain with Nemours after completion of the fellowship. Employment following the fellowship is not guaranteed.
